Membership .	Australian, State and Territory Government officials with responsibility for gambling regulation or Treasury portfolios and community and human services portfolios.
	The invitation for Western Australia to participate in the Select Council on Gambling Reform and its working groups has been declined but remains open. Western Australian officials receive papers and agendas for meetings at their request.
	New Zealand has been invited as an observer on the Rollcy Working Group.
Purpose	The Policy Working Group has been established by the Select Council on Gambling Reform to consider options for pre-commitment; dynamic warning and cost of play displays and ATM daily withdrawal limits and other issues as required.
Terms of Reference	The Policy Working Group will: inform the work of the Select Council on Gambling Reform by the development of a report with input from state and territory governments on key issues related to the proposals to progress:
	 a best practice full pre-commitment scheme that is uniform across all States and machines;
	 dynamic warning and cost of play displays for all Electronic Gaming Machines; and a \$250 daily withdrawal limit per card for Automatic Teller Machines (ATMs) in venues with Electronic Gaming Machines (excepting casinos).
	The report will provide a comprehensive overview of the key policy and implementation issues for the jurisdictions in achieving the reforms, including agreement on principles and features for each of the three reform elements.
	The Policy Working Group will consult and seek input from appropriate and relevant jurisdictional representatives where required to ensure a comprehensive picture is obtained for each jurisdiction.
	The Policy Working Group Will also advise on existing local data sources for each jurisdiction that may confeigute to a solid evidence base on the estimated impacts from implementation of these reforms.
, **	The Rollicy Working, Group will investigate other issues as directed by the Select Council or the Senior Officials Working Group.
Operations and Resourcing	Secretariat support for the Policy Working Group will be provided by the Commonwealth Department of Families, Housing, Community Services, and Indigenous Affairs.
Decision-Making	Decision making will be by consensus.
Frequency of meetings	Meetings will be held in November 2010, December 2010 and then as necessary to inform the work of the Senior Officials Working Group on Gambling Reform and the Select Council on Gambling Reform.
Reporting	Reports agreed by the Policy Working Group will be provided to the Senior Officials Working Group for consideration and presenting to the Select Council on Gambling Reform.

The Select Council requested a Policy Working Group be established to develop options to implement the following problem gambling reform proposals:

- a best practice full pre-commitment scheme that is uniform across all States and machines;
- dynamic warning and cost of play displays for all Electronic Gaming Machines; and
- a \$250 daily withdrawal limit per card for Automatic Teller Machines (ATMs) in venues with Electronic
 Gaming Machines (excepting casinos).

The Policy Working Group is to prepare a comprehensive report providing an overview of state and territory government positions, readiness and capacity to implement the above reforms.
