Minister Macklin referred Mr Lindsay's complaints to the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs' (FaHCSIA) Indigenous Programs Investigation Branch for further investigation in 2008.

This investigation included consultation with Mr Lindsay and the three Australian Government Departments that provided the majority of the funding to the four organisations he specifically mentioned.

This investigation determined that there were no criminal or civil matters disclosed that would warrant further investigation by FaHCSIA.

The Department is not aware of any current allegations of mismanagement relating to Townsville based Indigenous organisations.

The Australian Government has strict measures in place to ensure funding accountability and has the ability to take action if there is alleged impropriety.

Organisations funded by the Australian Government are issued with performance-based and legally enforceable funding agreements which set out the terms and conditions governing a business relationship.

FaHCSIA also has a complaints management process whereby any member of the public can lodge a concern about a FaHCSIA funded service providers, including the reporting of suspected fraud.

If the service provider is not funded by FaHCSIA, the complainant would be referred to the appropriate Department/Agency for action

I would like to make a time to speak to Ms Macklin at her earliest convenience about serious and long-running claims of mismanagement in some of Townsville's Indigenous organisations.

By way of background, the organisations involved all share board members and directors, who are composed largely of members of one local family.

Former Federal Member for Herbert Peter Lindsay mentioned this issue before the House of Representatives on June 24, 2008 http://www.aph.gov.au/hansard/reps/dailys/dr240608.pdf and wrote to Ms Macklin the following day requesting an open and detailed inquiry into the administration of four Townsville-based organisations. Current MP for Herbert Ewen Jones claims the office never received a reply to this letter or the parliamentary mention.

There have been numerous claims from the community, including former doctors and other staff of these organisations, of bullying and the misappropriation of funds and resources, which, they claim, have lead to reduced services for the significant and disadvantaged Aboriginal and Islander community in North Queensland.

I would appreciate the opportunity to discuss this important issue with Mc Macklin soon.
